Becoming a sponsor is the most profound expression of solidarity with those who have fled their home to escape violence and economic hardship. Most people arrive with a family or loved-one to host them. Some people arrive without long-term court accompaniment and housing support. Without refugee status, there are no services available leaving a gap in care at a crucial time.

You can change that!

Congregational mission teams and other community groups are ideal sponsors for people seeking asylum. The sponsorship relationship is both joyful and challenging and can vary from six months to over a year. Mobilizing a team to support the many aspects of sponsorship is straightforward and ensures that

those seeking asylum and the hosts build a strong working relationship.

The Texas Border Sponsorship Forum is a space where groups can explore if they are being called to serve in this way. This month we welcome:
