Use the following questions to guide personal study or facilitate small group discussions within your church. Focus on linking the issues to your local church and community, while keeping the broader global context in mind.

Explore Ways to Move From Discussion to Advocacy Translating Faith Into Action

- In response to Genesis 1:26-31, how should the church understand its role as a steward
 of creation and address the urgent issues of ecosystem destruction, climate change, and
 reliance on fossil fuels within our local and global contexts?
- Reflecting on Matthew 6:11 ("Give us today our daily bread."), how can communities
 and societies work towards establishing food systems that are not only sustainable and
 equitable but also respectful of cultural diversity and the rights of indigenous peoples,
 ensuring access to healthy and nourishing food for all?
- How can we, as a church community, better understand and address the effects of
 environmental racism on marginalized communities, and what specific actions can we
 take to support these communities in combating environmental injustices and promoting
 equitable access to clean air, water, and safe living conditions?
